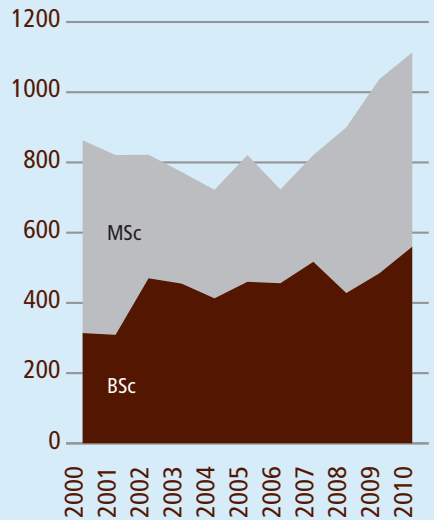

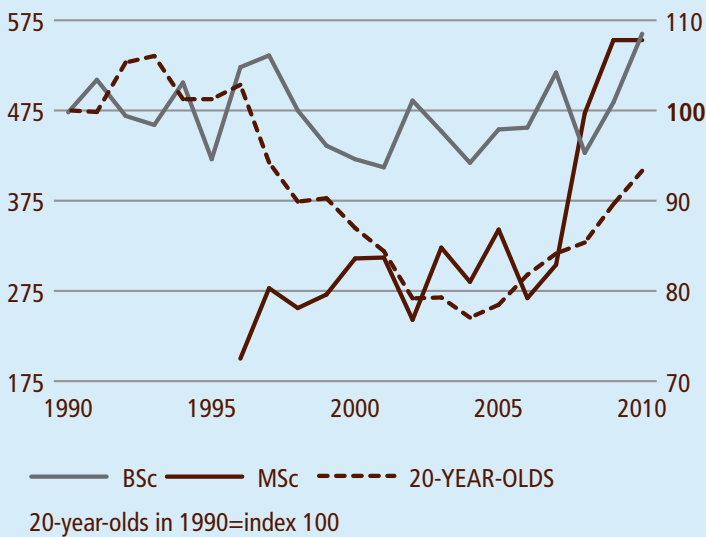

NUMBER OF STUDENTS ADMITTED 2002-10

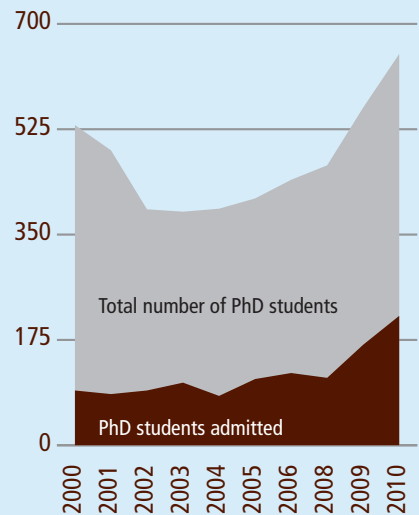

The graph above shows that, in a period characterised by a falling number of potential new students (20-year-olds), LIFE has seen a stable intake of BSc students. The graph also shows that, over the same period, LIFE has had a sharp rise in the number of MSc students, from 2008 among other things due to increased intake of veterinary students.

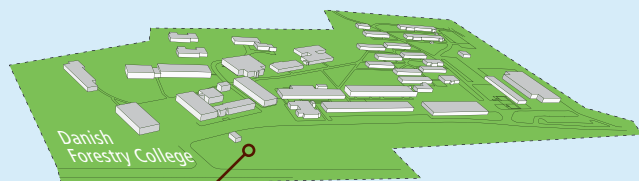

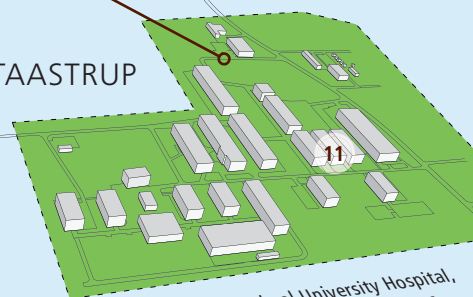

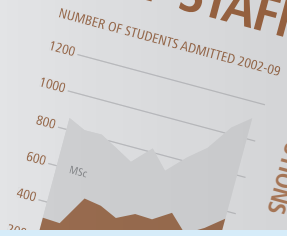

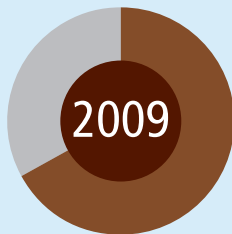

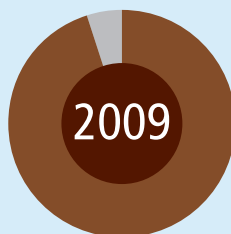

PERCENTAGE OF ALL COURSES TAUGHT IN ENGLISH

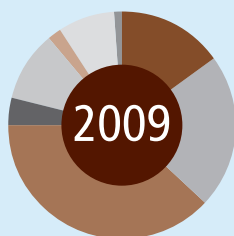

Danish 5% English 95%

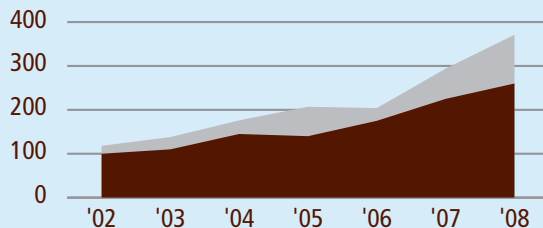
AN INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY OF 800 STUDENTS FROM 40 DIFFERENT COUNTRIES

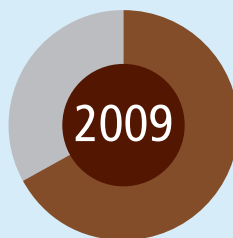
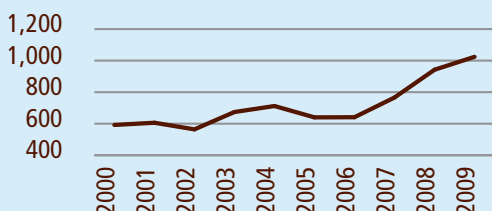
Research at LIFE
